THE CONTEXT

Under the **Modernisation Agenda**, the European Union encourages Member States to improve governance, funding, curriculum reforms in their higher education sector and in individual higher education institutions.

As a three-year EU-funded Structural Network (2008-2011) under the Lifelong Learning programme (ERASMUS), the MODERN European platform on higher education management is a response to the Modernisation Agenda and to the need to invest in people, to support future leaders and to encourage the professionalisation of higher education management at all levels.

A EUROPEAN PLATFORM ON HIGHER EDUCATION MANAGEMENT

Among others, MODERN (www.highereducationmanagement.eu) is a web-based community. The European platform is intended as an interactive information and meeting point for providers of higher education management programmes, experts, target group learners and interested stakeholders. Other activities of the platform include a survey on needs and demands for training programmes, five thematic conferences (governance, funding, internationalization and quality assurance, regional innovation knowledge transfer) and peer learning activities.

MAPPING THE FIELD

It is often difficult to locate training programmes for leaders and managers in higher education. MODERN is addressing this fragmentation of information with a two-fold mapping the field exercise:

- A **survey of the demand** and needs for training.
- A **survey on the supply** of training programmes in higher education management

Building on the results of this survey, MODERN will produce an open access inventory of training programmes in higher education management in Europe. With consortium partners it will seek how the gaps in the supply can be addressed.

HEDDA, Higher Education Development Association, and DUK, Danube University Krems, are the responsible project partners for the mapping the field exercise.

THEMATIC AND EXECUTIVE REPORTS

For each MODERN conference a report on the state-of-the art of reforms and developments of the issue addressed is produced. Building on the expertise in the MODERN partnership, CHEPS, Center for Higher Education Policy Studies, University of Twente, is producing the thematic reports.

All conference participants receive a printed copy of the report. Pdf versions are available on the MODERN website.

As a follow-up of each conference, a report is produced highlighting key issues of the presentations, discussions and workshops.

PEER LEARNING AND SENIOR LEADERSHIP SEMINARS

Building on an analysis of needs and methods, MODERN is currently designing a series of pilot peer learning activities to support both individual leaders (with senior leadership seminars) and institutions (with instrumental **peer learning** workshops on organizational issues linked to **funding, internationalization and knowledge transfer**). MODERN will conceptualise and test settings for peer learning workshops, building on “train-the-trainer” activities. Standards and guidelines for good practice in peer learning for higher education management will be defined.

With significant expertise in peer learning, CHE, Centre for Higher Education Development, Germany, and EFMD, European Foundation for Management Development, are designing these activities within MODERN.
